Pew poll's good and bad news

Carlson: *But, their not against Al Qaeda in the numbers that most people are, judging by these numbers, and they don't believe that Muslims were behind 9/11. So I just think...objectively that's a problem that they don't see it as one.*

Hooper: *If you look at the totality of the survey results, the views of American Muslims more or less mirror the views of people of all faiths of America: work hard to get ahead, send your kids to school...*

Carlson: *That's demonstrably untrue on these questions, just for the record.*

Hooper: *On several questions out of hundreds of questions, and it would be nice if you could focus on some of the positive aspects, instead of just cherry-picking a couple questions.*

Carlson: *I have some of the questions right here, they're not hundreds and I thought those were the most telling. And you're not concerned, but I am.*

Hooper: *I'm concerned that you would only pick negative ...and not positive...*

Carlson: *Oh you're a victim! Of course! I forgot it's always the media's fault! No one in the community is unreasonable it's only the media! I'm sorry, I forgot my talking points.*

Hooper: *No, I never criticize the media, the media's my friend.*
